Materials & Sizing

MATERIALS

- Worsted-weight yarn (#4): pumpkin color, brown and green
- 4.0 mm (G-6) crochet hook
- Polyester fiberfill
- Yarn needle, scissors and removable stitch marker
- Optional: 3.5 mm hook for a firmer stem and leaf

APPROXIMATE YARN AMOUNTS

- Small: 20-25 yd / 18-23 m
- Medium: 35-45 yd / 32-41 m
- Large: 55-70 yd / 50-64 m
- Accents: 5-10 yd / 5-9 m each of brown and green



FINISHED SIZES

Size	Panel	Approx. finished width	Approx. height
Small	12 sts x 24 rows	3 in / 7.5 cm	2 in / 5 cm
Medium	16 sts x 32 rows	4 in / 10 cm	2.75 in / 7 cm
Large	20 sts x 40 rows	5 in / 13 cm	3.5 in / 9 cm

ABBREVIATIONS

ch	chain	st(s)	stitch(es)
sl st	slip stitch	sc	single crochet
hdc	half double crochet	tr	treble crochet
BLO	back loop only	FO	fasten off

GAUGE & NOTES

Gauge: approximately 16 hdc BLO x 12 rows = 4 in / 10 cm. Exact gauge is not critical, but it changes the finished size.

- Turning chain does not count as a stitch.
- Keep the first and last stitch of every row snug.
- Count rows carefully so the seam closes evenly.

Important: The pumpkin body is worked flat. The ribbed rows should run from the top of the finished pumpkin to the bottom.

The Pumpkin Panels

Choose one size. Work all rows in the pumpkin color. Leave a long tail at the end for seaming and shaping.

SMALL PUMPKIN

Ch 13.

Row 1: Hdc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across. (12)

Row 2: Ch 1, turn. Hdc BLO in each st across. (12)

Rows 3-24: Repeat Row 2. (12)

FO, leaving a 36 in / 90 cm tail.



MEDIUM PUMPKIN

Ch 17.

Row 1: Hdc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across. (16)

Row 2: Ch 1, turn. Hdc BLO in each st across. (16)

Rows 3-32: Repeat Row 2. (16)

FO, leaving a 44 in / 110 cm tail.



LARGE PUMPKIN

Ch 21.

Row 1: Hdc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across. (20)

Row 2: Ch 1, turn. Hdc BLO in each st across. (20)

Rows 3-40: Repeat Row 2. (20)

FO, leaving a 52 in / 130 cm tail.



Adjusting the size: Add or remove foundation chains to change the height. Add or remove pairs of rows to change the circumference. Keep the rectangle roughly twice as wide as it is tall before seaming.

Assembly & Shaping

1

Join the rectangle

Fold the panel so the first and last rows meet. The ribs should run vertically. Whip stitch the row ends together to form a tube.

2

Close the bottom

Using the same yarn tail, weave through every row end around one open edge. Pull firmly, pass through the center twice, knot securely and turn the tube right side out.

3

Stuff and close

Fill evenly with fiberfill. Keep the center slightly softer so the pumpkin can flatten. Gather the second edge in the same way and close the opening.

4

Flatten the center

Push the needle from the top center through to the bottom center. Pull gently until the pumpkin becomes wider and flatter, then return the needle to the top.

5

Create six sections

Wrap the long yarn around the outside and pass through the center. Repeat five more times, spacing the wraps evenly. Tighten each wrap gradually so all six sections match.

6

Secure

Knot the shaping yarn at the top center. Hide the tail inside the pumpkin. Do not pull so tightly that the stitches become distorted.



Stem, Leaf & Curly Vine

STEM - MAKE 1

Use brown yarn. The stem is worked flat, rolled and sewn.

Small: Ch 5. Work 4 sc for 5 rows.

Medium: Ch 6. Work 5 sc for 6 rows.

Large: Ch 7. Work 6 sc for 7 rows.

Row 1: Sc in 2nd ch from hook and across.

Following rows: Ch 1, turn. Sc BLO across.

FO with a long tail. Roll the strip tightly and sew through the layers.

Sew the base to the top center.



LEAF - MAKE 1

Using green yarn, ch 8.

Starting in 2nd ch from hook, work:

sl st, sc, hdc, dc, tr, dc, 3 sc in last ch.

Rotate to work along the unused loops on the opposite side:

dc, tr, dc, hdc, sc, sl st.

Join with a sl st to the first sl st. FO with a 10 in / 25 cm tail.

For a smaller leaf, use a 3.5 mm hook. Lightly block the leaf before sewing if the edges curl.



CURLY VINE - MAKE 1

Small: Ch 26. **Medium:** Ch 34. **Large:** Ch 42.

Work 2 sc in 2nd ch from hook and 2 sc in every remaining ch. The strip will curl naturally. FO with a long tail.

Sew the leaf beside the stem, then attach one end of the vine under the leaf. Secure every piece through several firm stitches.



Color idea: Try cream, rust, muted sage or golden yellow for a coordinated autumn set. Keep the stem darker than the pumpkin so the details remain visible.

Finished Pumpkin Checklist



BEFORE YOU FINISH

- Seam is hidden inside a groove
- Top and bottom are tightly closed
- Six sections are spaced evenly
- Stem is centered and secure
- All yarn ends are hidden
- Stuffing is firm but not visible

CARE

Spot clean with cool water and mild soap. Reshape while damp and air dry completely. Do not machine dry.
